

Remote Learning for Students and Parents



Chippewa Valley Schools' 5 Guiding Principles during this school closure

1. We want to support students to be prepared for next school year.
2. We want to help students maintain and continue their learning from home.
3. We want to be flexible, have reasonable expectations and continue the important connections normally made through the classroom.
4. We want to provide support to our community to make sure learning can continue through June 15th.
5. We want to continue to support our students' physical, mental and emotional health.

Student Expectations

Students will:

- Be expected to continue their learning through June 15, 2020, for K-11 students. Seniors' last day of school is still scheduled for May 29, 2020.
- Check your Schoology account, Blackboard account, the district's student email accounts and/or Remind texts daily about coursework, lessons, and/or content. Students should receive information through Schoology or Blackboard from teachers about their expectations for the week and what you need to do to engage.
- Be expected to participate in their learning through daily/weekly lessons and activities on Schoology. Staff will follow up with students that are not engaged and offer district support.
- Receive feedback, instead of grades, on submitted assignments or tasks.
- Be able to communicate with staff through Schoology, email, other means, and "virtual office hours."
- Contact the teacher if they don't understand something by using multiple tools, including Schoology, email, and any other platform for communication the teacher utilizes. Teachers will continue to support students in their learning.
- Please understand teachers may not be able to respond right away. We ask for patience if a student does not receive communication from the teacher on the same day they reach out.
- Use proper etiquette for online learning (see below).
- Be encouraged to participate as much as you can and need to stay in communication with your teachers if you expect to earn credit. **No letter grades will be given during remote learning.** Students will receive feedback on submitted work, and work may be graded on a complete/incomplete basis.
- **Participation and engagement are critical in preparing for the next level of learning.** Elementary students' participation will be documented for all future considerations. At the end of the semester, secondary students will receive a CR (pass/credit) or an I (incomplete/no credit). This will be based on the participation of the student and the work submitted. This will not impact a student's GPA either positively or negatively.
- Secondary students who make no effort to complete the work will receive an incomplete. An incomplete would not result in credit being granted. If that credit is needed for graduation, the student will need to make up the credit through credit recovery or summer school. If a student meets the criteria in the Executive Order the teacher will make appropriate accommodations.

Online Etiquette Reminders:

- Use respectful behavior and language.
- Stick to appropriate topic discussions.
- Wear school appropriate clothing when attending meetings via video.
- Be honest. Do not plagiarize or copy others' work.
- Treat others online as you would want to be treated in person.



Information for Parents

The new learning plan will officially begin on April 22, 2020. This plan will streamline the learning process by focusing on essential standards, recognizing appropriate time commitments for students, and providing flexibility considering the current situation most families are facing. Moving forward, the "less is more" approach will be evident.

We recommend that families establish a "school schedule" that meets their individual needs. We recognize that this can be stressful and are hopeful that a "less is more" approach will ease some of the stress that families feel while balancing school and life. Balance each day is important to support the emotional well-being of our students and families.

By early next week, parents will receive email communication with Schoology login information specific to the grade level of their child/children. The directions will be designed for students/parents who have not accessed Schoology prior to the school building closures.

Schoology allows teachers to directly communicate with their students and/or families. If you have any questions and concerns, please communicate directly with your child's teachers. Your feedback is important and valued.
